### NBA All State Band

The NBA All State Band for January of 2022 will feature a return of one of our best NBA All State Band Conductors. Dr. Joseph Hermann, formerly of Tennessee Tech University will return to the podium to provide a wonderful and challenging experience for our top students. His program will be posted as soon as I have it.

If you have had students participate in the past, you know the quality of this experience for our students and profession If you have not had students participate in the past, please do so NOW. Your students will have a chance to interact with some of the finest musicians in our state and to rehearse and perform with a world famous conductor/composer. All of this in just one weekend at a first class music facility.

Some additional information:

1. We will follow UW Oshkosh Covid protocols and we will update as we get closer to the event. Current mask mandate.

2. A consideration that we are declaring now is that the band will have between 60-70 members this year to allow for spacing.

3. The event will remain a 2 day event with rehearsal beginning at 2pm on Friday and culminating with the Finale Concert on Saturday night, January 22.

4. Fees are \$135 per student this year to allow for 2 students per room for housing. Attempts will be made to house "by school" when possible Communication will take place with directors once the band is selected regarding housing information. NOTE that this fee covers housing, guest conductor, all meals when on site and transportation at the convention. NOTE also that T-Shirt will be available for an additional fee.

Reminders when submitting applicants:

1. All Schools receive placement of their #1 ranked applicant. It is CRUCIAL that you rank only 1 student #1 Don't play games here, just rank the one student that you feel needs to have this experience first.

2. All schools will receive a 2nd student before any school gets a 3rd student. NOTE: this may NOT be your #2 ranked student as I switch to "instrumentation needs" after placing your #1 student in the band. Often 1 or 2 sections are "full" after #1 students are placed in the band. Your second student will be based on instrumentation needs. Advice, still just submit an application for students that you think are deserving of this experience. There is NEVER a guarantee as to which sections will have needs and which will fill quickly so don't overthink it, just submit.

3. Please only submit students who are able to attend that weekend.
